Impact at Kempton Park Laerskool



At Kempton Park Laerskool, we are already witnessing encouraging progress through the work of LLCP Life Coach, Lonwabo.

Lonwabo has been consistently engaging with learners on a daily basis—building meaningful relationships, offering guidance, and helping students develop greater discipline, focus, and emotional awareness. His presence is making a noticeable difference in how learners respond both inside and outside the classroom.

Teachers and staff have expressed sincere appreciation for the support, and we are seeing positive shifts in learner behaviour, attitude, and participation. This growing impact is a powerful reminder of how consistent mentorship and intentional presence can help shape a healthier and more responsive school environment.

We are also encouraged by the involvement of Mr Pieters, the school's sports coach and a committed born-again believer, who is planning sports camps as an additional platform to reach and inspire learners for Christ.
